In Remembrance of a Life well lived

LaMaris Blondell Schumpert Mack was born in Columbia, South Carolina on July 21, 1945. She was the younger of two daughters born to the late John Barton and Rubie Nixon Schumpert. Her heavenly life began on the morning of Tuesday, June 9, 2026.

LaMaris was educated in the public school system of Richland County, South Carolina, and graduated in the C. A. Johnson High School, Class of 1962. She furthered her education and earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing from North Carolina A&T State University, Greensboro, NC. She was an active supporter of C. A. Johnson High School and the Columbia Alumni Chapter of NC A&T State University.

On the evening of August 30, 1969 on the lawn of her parent’s home, LaMaris was united in Holy Matrimony to her childhood sweetheart, Paul Mack, Jr. To this union two beautiful children were born.

At an early age, LaMaris professed her faith and was baptized at Mt. Zion Baptist Church, in Chapin, South Carolina. In 1981, she began serving as First Lady at Young’s Chapel Baptist Church, Columbia, SC. At the time of her transition, LaMaris was a member of Central Baptist Church, where she sang on the Jubilee Choir and served with the Missionary Society.

LaMaris dedicated her life to the healthcare profession. She began her professional Career in South Carolina, at the Old Columbia Hospital, in the 70’s. Throughout her career, she worked at the SC Department of Juvenile Justices RNE infirmary, then transferred to the SC Department of Mental Health, and worked at Crafts Farrow, Dowdy-Garden Nursing Care Center, and retired as Director of Nursing from C. M. Tucker Nursing Care Facility in 2004.

Mrs. Mack was an active member of the Baptist Ministers’ Wives and Ministers’ Widows Alliance of Greater Columbia and Vicinity, South Carolina Association of Ministers’ Widows (SCAMWMW), and International Association of Ministers’ Wives’ and Ministers’ Widows (IAMWMW). Ms. Mack served these organizations faithfully and held various leadership positions over the years.

Mrs. Mack was preceded in death by her parents, John Barton and Rubie Nixon Schumpert and her husband, Paul Mack, Jr.
